Per JTR Appendix A – Definitions & Acronyms:

➤ Professional Books, Papers & Equipment (PBP&E aka Pro Gear) is defined as items in a member's/employee's possession needed for the performance of official duties at the next or a later Permanent Duty Station (PDS) (including Home of Record (HOR) or Home of Selection (HOS) when leaving the service).

Professional Books, Papers & Equipment (PBP&E) Definition

PBP&E are articles of HHG in a member's possession needed for the performance of official duties at the next or a later destination, per JTR, Appendix A

PBP&E does INCLUDE:

- PBP&E includes PBP&E does not include PBP&E are articles of HHG in a member's possession needed for the performance of official duties at the next or a later destination, per JTR, Appendix A
- Reference material not ordinarily available at the next permanent duty station;
- Instruments, tools, and equipment peculiar to technicians, mechanics, medical professionals, musicians and members of the professions;
- Specialized clothing such as diving suits, astronauts' suits, flying suits and helmets, band uniforms, chaplains' vestments, and other specialized apparel not normal or usual uniform or clothing;
- Communication equipment used by a DoD member or employee in association with the Military Auxiliary Radio System (MARS)
- Individually owned or specially issued field clothing and equipment; and
- Gov't or uniformed service owned accountable organizational clothing and individual equipment issued to the employee or member by the Service/DoD COMPONENT for official use.

PBP&E does NOT INCLUDE

- Commercial products for sale/resale used in conducting business;
- Homeschool equipment/items
- Sports equipment;
- Furniture of any kind, to include shop fixtures, even though used ICW the PBP&E (e.g., bookcases, desks, file cabinets, and racks);
- Personal computers and peripheral devices;
- Memorabilia including awards, plaques or other objects presented for past performance;
- Table service including flatware, dishes (including serving pieces, salvers and their heating units), other utensils, and glassware; and/or
- Other items of a professional nature that are not necessary at the next/subsequent duty station
 - Text books from previous schools unrelated to future duties
 - Personal books, even if used as part of a past professional reading program or course of instruction
 - Reference material that ordinarily would be available at the next/subsequent duty station either in hard copy or on the Internet.

Weight Limits (JTR U5268-B)

- Before 1 May 2014 orders issue date: no limit
- On 1 May 2014 and after orders issue date: 2,000 lbs. NO EXCEPTIONS and NO waiver exists
- Exceptions:
 - Member returning from Outside Continental US (OCONUS aka overseas) or executing a consecutive OCONUS tour (back to back overseas orders) and orders were issued prior to 1 May 2014

NOTE: the Pro Gear in excess of 2,000 lbs. **MUST** have been originally shipped at government expense to the OCONUS location



Spouse Pro Gear

- Navy: spouse pro gear MUST be approved in writing by the local PPPO (Personal Property Processing Office) PRIOR to pack/pickup.
- Spouse Pro Gear cannot exceed 500 lbs.
- Spouse Pro Gear includes items for spouse's employment or community support activities at the next destination
- > Includes:
 - Reference material(s)
 - Instruments, tools and equipment
 - Specialized clothing (i.e. diving suit, flying suit, band uniform, nurse uniform, chaplains' vestments, etc.) not normal or usual uniform or clothing





Unauthorized Items

Pro Gear does not include:

- Commercial products for sale/resale used in conducting business
- Sports Equipment
- Office furniture
- Household furniture (e.g. bookcases, desk, file cabinet)
- Shop fixtures
- Furniture of any kind
- Personal computer equipment & peripheral devices
- Memorabilia including awards, plaques or other objects presented for past performance
- ❖ Table service including flatware (including service pieces), dishes (including serving pieces, salvers and their heating units), other utensils & glassware.
- Other items that are not necessary at the next/subsequent duty station

Instructions



- MUST indicate Pro Gear and/or Spouse Pro Gear in DPS and provide estimated weight(s)
- Pro Gear and Spouse Pro Gear must be weighed separately (from each other and from household goods)
- Annotated separately on inventories (PRO/Pro Gear/PBP&E/Spouse Pro Gear)
- NOTE: on inventories, spouse pro gear and member pro gear MUST be annotated separately (not just labelled "pro gear")
- Separated from other items AND member's Pro Gear
- Spouse Pro Gear Navy members must have prior approval in writing and provide a list of items to be included. CANNOT exceed 500 lbs.
